

## **Rehnquist Weatherproofs Court Calendar**

There are other reminders of the Court's low-tech state. Last August, Professor Jerry Goldman of Northwestern University, who is director of the innovative Oyez Project, wrote to the Court asking it to slightly modify its current practice of turning over oral argument tapes at the end of each term. Goldman takes the tapes and puts them up on his site, <http://oyez.nwu.edu>, for easy Internet listening.

Goldman asked that the Court allow for the release of the argument tapes on the same day that the decision in the case is made public. "The public would have a better grasp, quickly, of what the Court had done," says Goldman.

The letter was signed by other Court luminaries, ranging from Harvard Professor Laurence Tribe to practitioners Roy Englert Jr. and Alan Untereiner of Mayer, Brown & Platt, to New York Times Supreme Court correspondent Linda Greenhouse. "I wanted to demonstrate that the idea had wide support among the Court's many constituencies."
