When Roy Englert Jr. finished his oral argument before the U.S. Supreme Court in *Scheidler v. NOW* on Dec. 4, he did not return to the same counsel table where he had started.

Instead, he dropped back to the table reserved for lawyers arguing the next case of the day -- and sat next to one of his law partners, Lawrence Robbins, who, like Englert, is a co-founder of Washington, D.C.'s Robbins, Russell, Englert, Orseck & Untereiner.

Two Supreme Court arguments in one day. Not bad for a law firm that opened its doors only 19 months ago. But also not completely surprising. Four of the five name partners were defectors from the D.C. office of the firm now known as Mayer, Brown, Rowe & Maw, home of one of the best-known and largest Supreme Court practices anywhere.
