

Chavez v. Martinez

The Supreme Court ruled on May 27, 2003, that a police sergeant did not violate the Fifth Amendment rights of a gravely wounded farm worker by interrogating him (without Miranda warnings) during his transportation to and treatment in an emergency room. The Court also reversed the Ninth Circuit's holding that the interrogation violated the Fourteenth Amendment and remanded for further proceedings the question whether Martinez could state a substantive due process claim.

Hillside Dairy v. Lyons

The Supreme Court ruled on June 9, 2003, that the Ninth Circuit had improperly dismissed challenges under the Commerce Clause and the Privileges and Immunities Clause to California's disparate treatment of California dairies and out-of-state dairies in its economic regulation of milk.
